Seeking community volunteers to help adjudicate the CKHF 2021-2022 Grant Cycle.

[KINGSTON, ONT./ 30 July 2021] The Kingston Association of Museums, Art Galleries and Historic Sites (KAM) is seeking interested community volunteers to help adjudicate the 2021-2022 City of Kingston Heritage Fund grant program.

The City of Kingston Heritage Fund is entering its ninth grant cycle. KAM has administered the heritage fund on behalf of the City of Kingston since its introduction to the Kingston community. "The City of Kingston Heritage Fund program, with its operating and project categories, continues to transform Kingston's cultural heritage landscape in positive, innovative and diverse ways, improving access and community engagement. Cultural heritage is a public common. A vibrant, diverse and responsive cultural heritage sector reflects and amplifies vibrant, diverse and responsive communities. Now more than ever, this type of investment is critical to support community resiliency. CKHF grant applications are adjudicated using an impartial, peer assessment process that engages stakeholders from across Kingston as jury members. Jury members are community volunteers, with a range of knowledge, skills, and experience, who are passionate about Kingston's cultural heritage, and where possible, are reflective of the gender, demographic and cultural diversity of Kingston itself. "

As a CKHF Juror, you will be working with the CKHF Adjudication Chair, who oversees two separate adjudication committees – one for operating grants, the other for project grants, as well as the Grant Review Officer and Grant Support Coordinator.

For the 2021-2022 grant cycle, the Adjudication Committee meeting will take place through Microsoft Teams, and will involve two separate sessions over a period of two weeks.
