The Museum will also explore the connection between mental health and food with special displays and interactive activities.

Macpherson House and Park

An 1830's historic house detailing early Canadian life. Step back in time and imagine what life was like almost 200 years ago. The House is completely furnished and restored to its 1930s splendour. Enjoy the beautiful views of the Napanee River and the heritage Lady's Garden.

Museum of Lennox and Addington

This historic building now houses the County Museum and Archives. Explore its stone walls and discover the county stories through programs, exhibits, and archives located in the former 1863 jail. A fun gift shop, new exhibits, and lively programs keep this site entertaining all year long.
